This sum, being apportioned as aforesaid, and the parts being respectively deducted from the estimated cost of the independent lines, (to wit: Canal, \$28,102.25, Rail Road, \$5,556.30) will show the proper estimates of the cost of the Canal and of the Rail Road, respectively, so far as they were in collision at Happer's Ferry Narrows—both together amounting to \$33,154.75.

It will be seen that we have not finally closed the calculation by stating, in the foregoing part of this report, in what proportion the additional estimated cost of \$9,524.97 at the lower Point of Rocks, and of \$5,039.48, at the Upper Point of Rocks, should be added to, nor in what proportions the decreased estimated con of \$1,435.10 at Miller's Narrows, and of \$503.80 at Harpers Ferry Narrows, should be subtracted from, the respective estmates of the cost of each work on their independent locations The reason of this, we think it proper those respective places. to state, is that we do not agree in the propriety of doing so-Mr. Roberts is of opinion that, according to our instructions, belongs to us to make the apportionment; and he is prepared to recommend, that, it be made in equal parts, each company par taking or suffering equally of the gain or loss.-Whilst M. Knight is not clear as to the propriety of our recommending is what proportions the said sums should be divided, and therefor, on this occasion, declines giving an opinion, no letter of in structions having been received from the Canal Company in pur suance of any resolution of the Canal Board embracing this point

We may here observe, that when the amount of the estimates respectively shall have been ascertained as before mentioned, it will be necessary to add ten per cent. for contingencies and superintendence to get the final amount for each work.

The following statement will point out the advantage to the two companies, of constructing the works contemplated in the foregoing estimates, conjointly; and on the other hand, the low which would accrue from a contrary course.
