Resolved by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio,
That they concur in the opinion of the Legislature of Pennsylvania, as expressed in the following Resolution:

“Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That the Tariff of eighteen hundred and twenty-eight, accords with the spirit of the Constitution of the U. States, and that it maintains the true principles of protection to the industry of the country against foreign policy and Legislation”

Resolved, That the Governor be requested to transmit a copy of the foregoing Resolution to each of the Governors of the several States of the Union, with a request to have the same laid before their respective Legislatures; and also, forward copies of the same to each of our Senators and Representatives in Congress.
