In the statement of the Union Bank of Maryland, the "specie" includes the "notes of specie paying banks," and their "notes in circulation" include "debts due to banks, incorporations, and individuals;" also, in the statement of the Hagers Town Bank, "specie funds" is included in their representation of "specie on hand"—these are terms so vague and indefinite, that the truth cannot be ascertained from them.

It is as well to be remarked, that the several statements are exhibited under different dates, varying from December 22d, 1828, to January the 12th, 1829, during which interval of time very considerable mutations have occurred; and it may be prefumed, that the most favorable day was selected by each institution: from all which it may be inferred, that the actual amount of specie in the Banks of this State, is far below the apparent aggregate of their several statements.
