

**EASTERN SHORE TREASURY,**

*Easton, December 1, 1830.*

To the Honourable,  
the General Assembly of Maryland:

In reporting to your honourable body the within list of balances outstanding upon the books of this office, I would beg leave to append the following information in relation to the condition and state of said balances, as derived, in part, from the several deputy state's attornies, in whose hands most of said claims have been placed for collection, in pursuance of the act of the last session of the legislature, ch. 90, entitled, An act to provide for the collection of the public revenue.

**William P. Ridgaway.**

This claim has been prosecuted as far as legal process can avail, the party being insolvent.

**George W. Lightner.**

The judgments against him and his securities, have been revived by sci. fa. but it is believed they are all insolvent.

**Robert Oldson.**

This claim too has been prosecuted to insolvency.

**William S. Handy.**

Judgments were obtained against the principal and his securities at May term 1820. — The only efficient securities are since dead, and their real estates have been sold for the payment of their debts, and this claim is placed in a situation to be paid out of the proceeds upon the final adjustment.

**Robert C. Lusby.**

There are judgments against Mr. Lusby and his securities, and it is believed this debt will ultimately be recovered.

**Nathan Betton.**

This claim is considered desperate, the principal and securities being insolvent.

**Geo. Dashiell, of Jno.**

This is a claim on his third year's bond, which has been determined in Somerset county court to be defective; of course no recovery can be had thereon.
