pense attending the whole, was to render the monument complete and finished, being much less than the Legislature have immagined, and which its liberality may easily sapply by similar appropriations for this year and the next, if it shall be jound necessary to make any the next year, and to avoid which every economy in the expenditure will be used on the part of the managers.

The whole of the cornice of the basement with one course of the marble covering has been executed during the course of the year, and the remainder of the covering, the steps, &c. it is hoped will easily be added in the course of the

next.

Requesting you to lay this information before the Assembly when it meets, and trusting that it will prove satisfactory.
