Sir,—In compliance with the requisition of the Legislature, I beg leave to state the proceedings of the Managers of the Washington Monument, since my last report to you of 4th January last.

The balance then remaining in the Treasurer's hands was \$928 45

On the 1st April last, a certificate of 10,000 dollars, 5 per cent. stock of the State of Maryland, redeemable at the pleasure of the State from the avails of the lottery system. was received from you in part of 20,000 dollars granted by the Legislature for the use of the Monument during the present year, and which was disposed of at par, producing 10,000 00

On the 1st July, another certificate was received for 5,000 dollars, producing 5,000 00

And on the 1st October, another for the balance of the 20,000 dollars, producing 5,000 00

Total funds at the disposal of the Managers, \$20,928 45

On the 7th April, Col. Steuart was paid on account of the work done by him last year, and remaining to be executed, the sum of \$10,000 00

And, very recently, the balance due him per his bill, 8,444 96
