for Contingent and Miscellaneous Expenses, have, it will be seen, greatly exceeded their estimated amount, and accordingly, the striking improvement in the general revenue of the State, has not, as it must have done if the means of paying the excess only of those appropriations had been duly supplied, had any anspicious influence on its present state.
