WESTERN SHORE TREASURY, Annapolis, 23d Feb. 1839.

To the Honorable the House of Delegates,

In obedience to your order of the 19th, the Treasurer has the honor to state that, no income from that portion of the surplus revenue of the United States of which the interest was, by ch. 220 of 1836, declared to be distributable among the several counties and the city of Baltimore, for the support and encouragement of Common School Education in this State, was received in the year 1837.

In pursuance of that act, it was specially deposited on the 29 March, 1 April, and 1 July, 1837, to the credit of the State, and subject (not to the check of the Treasurer,) but to "the future control and appropriation of, the next General Assembly."

The said act for its deposite, was not passed until the 18 March, 1837—the General Assembly continued in session until the 23d-and as early after, as it was possible, the Treasurer proceeded to Baltimore and effected the deposite of the first instalment on the 29th, and of the second and third (not after they might have been received, but) as of the very days on
