

The Geographical surveys having been suspended since April, 1837, until they could be resumed in connection with the United States Coast survey, the salary of the Topographical Engineer was then also suspended—and no further payments have been since made on account of them.

The same Report of the Treasurer, shewed also in detail, that the payments made from the Treasurer for account of the Geological surveys of the state, had on the 12th January, 1838, amounted to
