of the cotton goods of the Maryland Penitentiary from the date hereof to the 1st day of December next.

He is to advance to the Institution in cash, as the same may be wanted, eighty-seven and a half per cent of the market price value of the goods which are to be delivered to him or placed under his control.

In addition to the usual commission of 7 1-2 per cent for sales and guarantee, he is to be allowed a further commission of two and a half per cent upon all cash advances.

It is understood that the goods thus placed in the hands or under the control of Henry Tiffany, for account of the Penitentiary, are to be under the usual supervision and direction of the executive committee of the Institution as heretofore, but also with the understanding, that as it mast be the mutnal interest of both parties to this agreement, to realize as soon as practicable, at fair market prices, no restrictions above such rates shall be interposed on the part of the Penitentiary. Interest upon advances to be allowed as usual, and the Penitentiary is to have the benefit of interest in cash sales from the time of making the same.
