Gentlemen:-

On behalf of the citizens of Georgetown, and that portion of Washington county in the District of Columbia, which lies west of Rock Creek, and without the corporate limits of said Town, we had the honor to memorialize the last Legislature of your State, seeking the re-annexation of the territory aforesaid to the State of Maryland, and a return to its legislative jurisdiction.

The application having failed in the House of Delegates, from the want of time for its due consideration, having been made only a few days previous to the final adjournment of the Legislature, we would most respectfully present it again to your honorable bodies, and solicit for it your serious consideration.

We will not now re-state the grounds of our application, but respectfully refer you to our memorial, and the accompanying papers, on the files of the papers and proceedings of the last Legislature, as containing them.
