for George Beckenbaugh. It was in other respects fair and not rumpled. Witness's first impression, was, that the ticket ought to be counted, but there was so much noise and confusion about it that he let it be rejected. There was no other name added to the printed ticket. David F. Yantis keeps a tavern at present in Woodsborough, in Frederick county.

GEORGE BARRICK.

Samuel Willhide being sworn, deposeth and saith: That he was present at the counting of the ballots in Woodsborough district. Saw both the double tickets alluded to by Mr. Crumbaugh, the judge aforesaid. The tickets were attached together in each case. He looked at them both at the time they were rejected, in each case the tickets were partly cut asunder, one rather more than the other. The paper upon which the tickets were printed was thin and the tickets adhered together. Witness was very near giving away tickets similarly situated, but discovered the mistake in time to prevent the error, and before he quit cutting apart the tickets. In every instance his tickets were cut entirely apart. Witness tried to get the tickets that were voted at the election, on the day after, but could not.

SAMUEL WILLHIDE.

Jacob Birely further examined. States, that he cannot say

whether the second double ticket taken from the ballot box by him was cut assunder or not, the first was certainly partly

attached.

Jacob Root being sworn, deposeth and saith: States that he was present at the counting of the ballots in Woodsborough district, in Frederick county; that he saw both the double tickets testified to by Mr. Crumbaugh. They were attached together in each instance, in one instance a little more than the other, but partly cut asunder in both instances.
