He has also shewn to the satisfaction of your Committee, by the exhibition of proper vouchers, that in the same time, he converted \$33,223.11 cents, the balance of the special deposites in the Union Bank of Maryland belonging to the sinking fund, into 5 per cent stock of the State, as directed by chap. 299 of the acts of December session, 1834.

That it appears to your committee, there remains in the Treasury as of 1st December, 1839, to the credit of the said said funds, a balance in cash of twenty-four thousand, seven hundred and thirty-eight dollars and ninety-eight cents; and this sum too, they find, stands to his credit as Treasurer, in the Farmers' Bank of

Maryland.
