To His Excellency WILLIAM GRASON,

Governor of Maryland.

The directors representing the stock of the State in the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company having received your Excellency's letter of the 9th inst., containing a series of enquiries relative to the affairs of the company, respectfully reply:

That having stated the nature of the enquiries to the board, at their meeting of Wednesday last, they passed a resolution requesting the President to furnish the State Directors, with the requisite information.
