

the board issued the notes of the company of the several denominations of five, ten and twenty dollars, payable at six months after date, with interest, in anticipation of funds to be derived from the late subscription of the State to the stock of the company, to the amount of \$240,000. These were chiefly used in paying contractors and others on the line of the canal; and of the amount issued \$234,100 have been redeemed, leaving outstanding on the 1st of January, 1839, the sum of \$5,900.

4th. In the month of April, 1838, a further issue of notes was made of the respective denominations of five, ten and twenty dollars, payable on demand, to the amount of \$80,000. These were paid out on the line of the canal, and were on the 1st of January, 1839, all outstanding.
