the company on the one hand, or to those having open accounts with it on the other.

The former boards honored me with their confidence, I have enjoyed their good will and friendship and have received from them, all, and more than all that was a bargain between us. I have above stated every item of pecuniary consideration I have ever received from the company. I should have been gratified that the present board had, at the moment of parting with me at least have bade me farewell, with the added official expression of their estimate of my services.

My labors of nearly 16 years will be concluded, when it shall please this committee to permit me to return to my home.
