

John Field, keeper of lock No. 22, in place of M. F. Harris resigned, and Jacob L. Schnebly rodman on the first division.

September 16, 1840.

It was ordered, that J. A. Carter be requested to take legal means, for the eviction of W. H. Hammontru, from the property of this company, now occupied by him, lying in Montgomery county, Maryland, and to give possession of the same to O. Bozwell recently appointed lock keeper in the place of said Hammontru.

November 14, 1840.

The letter of B. F. Brannan resigning his office of rodman. his resignation was accepted, and George Bowles of Middletown was appointed in his place.

Samuel Tyler was appointed treasurer and accountant in the place of Robert Barnard, and directed to call on Mr. B. in Washington, and procure all papers, books and effects belonging to the company now in his hands.

Edward Schriver was appointed assistant clerk in place of S. Fillebrown, Jr. Ezra Houck was appointed collector general with power to supervise all collectors of toll, to whom all such officers shall hereafter report, transmitting to him all way bills, manifests and other papers pertaining to their office, and pay over all money received by them. His compensation to be \$1,000 per annum.

It was resolved, that Robert Barnard and Thomas Fillebrown, Jr. be informed that should they deem it necessary to visit Frederick, to effect a settlement of their accounts with the company, that their expenses would be defrayed by the company.

December 3, 1840.

Ordered that Wm. Pitts be appointed commissioner in place of Wm. Matthews resigned, and that the clerk notify him.

December 10, 1840.

A letter from Wm. Pitts, dated 7 Dec. 1840, declining to accept the appointment of commissioner, was read. Ordered that S. M. Semmes of Cumberland be appointed in the place of Wm. Matthews resigned and that he be notified of his appointment.
