

## FROM WORCESTER COUNTY.

The clerk, Mr. Cord Hazzard, writes as follows:

“I find from the best calculation that I can now make, that the slaves of this county are valued as follows:—The average price of those under fourteen years is eighty-five dollars;—the average price of males from fourteen to forty-five years, is two hundred and twenty-five dollars;—the average price of females from fourteen to thirty-six years, is one hundred and forty dollars. There are so few males and females above forty-five and thirty-six years, that are valued at any thing, that I have not attempted to fix any particular average price on them, as it would be very small.”

## FROM TALBOT COUNTY.

Males,—from 14 to 45 years, healthy,	-	\$400
do. “ 25 to 30 do.	- - -	350
do. “ 30 to 35 do.	- - -	300
do. “ 35 to 40 do.	- - -	250
do. “ 40 to 45 do.	- - -	200

Upwards of forty-five years in proportion if healthy, if unhealthy they were considered as worthless.

Females—from 14 to 25 years, if healthy,	\$300
do. “ 25 to 30 do. do.	- 250
do. “ 30 to 36 do. do.	- 200

Upwards in proportion if healthy, if not they were considered worthless.

Males from 1 to 14 years were valued at \$25 for one year, and twenty-five dollars per year was added for every year up to 14 years if healthy.

Females from 1 to 14 years \$20 at one year, and \$20 for every year up to 14 years.
