Statement of Free Tickets issued by the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company.

By resolution of the Board passed at their meeting on the 7th

of October, 1842, as follows:

Resolved, That each of the Stockholders, including the Governor of the State, the Secretary of State, the Treasurer of the Western Shore, each member of the Legislature, the Mayor of the City, and each of the members or the City Council, be permitted to make one trip over the road, free of charge, at any time from the opening of the road until the 1st of December ensuing, under such regulations as the President may prescribe.

At their meeting on the 2nd of November last, the Board extended the time to the 1st of January, and on the 7th of December they made a further extension of the time to the 1st of June

next.

Besides these, no free tickets are issued; but the right of free travel over the road by various resolutions of the Board, has been

and is now extended to the following persons, viz:

The President, Directors, Secretary and Clerks of this Company. The wives and children of the President, Directors and Secretary. The Engineers and persons employed in the Engineer Department.

The Superintendent and Agents in the employ of this Company.

The Cashier of the Patapsco Bank.

The privilege of free travel having been granted to the officers of this company, the same has been reciprocated to the following companies; that is to say,

To the Stage Proprietors of the firms of Stockton, Falls & Co.,

and Hutchinson & Weast.

The President of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company.

The President and Vice President of the Philadelphia, Wilming-

ton and Baltimore Rail Road Company.

The Presidents of the Baltimore and Susquehanna, of the New Castle and Frenchtown, of the Richmond and Fredericksburg, of the Petersburg and Roanoke, of the Annapolis and Elk Ridge, and of the Winchester and Potomac Rail Road Companies.

Each of the Counsel of, and the Agents in procuring the right of

way for the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company.

Special agents of the Post Office Department travel free in pursuance of the Company's contract with the Department for conveying the Mail.
