From this it will be seen that the inspections of the year was exceedingly large, and increased above that of the previous year about 7,000 hogsheads; and there were inspected in January 1843, 401 hhds., being 194 more than during the same month in the year 1842. There was remaining on hand in the different warehouses, unshipped, on the 1st of January, 1842, 7,857 hhds., as follows:

Making in all 54,507 hogsheads, the stock of the year 1842, of which however 3 hogsheads, at No. 3 Warehouse, were condemned. The amount of shipments of tobacco from the four warehouses was also very large—in all amounting to 44,837 hogsheads, as follows:
