Which the tobacco fund is entitled to for outage, at \$1,25 per hogshead,—making an amount of \$67,535—and there were shipped from February 1, 1842, to February 1, 1843, 47,437 hogsheads, for which the said fund is credited, at \$1,25 per hogshead; making an amount of \$59,296; and there was remaining on hand in the warehouses, February 1, 1843, 7,261 hogsheads, which, at \$1,25 per hogshead, is \$9,076; this added to the amount shipped, makes \$68,372, from which deduct the amount which the fund is entitled to, leaves \$837 received by the warehouses, for sales of scrap tobacco, extra cooperage, &c.
