That it appears to your committee there remains in the Treasury as of 1st December, 1843, the balance of seventy-three thousand, three hundred and seventeen dollars and ten cents—which they find stands to his credit as Treasurer, in the Farmers Bank of Maryland—and that it is subject to the following charges to that day, then remaining unpaid, viz:
