

REPORT.

The committee of Claims beg leave to report that in accordance with an order adopted by the House of Delegates the 13th inst. they examined the proceedings and documents of James S. Owens, late Treasurer of the Western Shore of Maryland, and find from an account settled to the 1st December, 1843, by your committee, there then remained in the Treasury seventy-three thousand three hundred and seventeen dollars and ten cents.
