That it appears to your Committee there remains in the Treasury as of 1st December, 1844, to the credit of the Free School's Fund and Sinking Fund, a balance in cash of twenty-three thousand one hundred and six dollars, and thirty-one cents—and this sum too, they find stands to his credit as Treasurer, in the Farmers' Bank of Maryland.
