advise a further arrangement with the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company, it will only be one of a subordinate and auxiliary character, and after an efficient law shall be passed, providing for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal at least to

Cumberland, at the earliest practicable period.

We would also respectfully state, that the funding of the existing debts of the company, and placing them on an equitable basis, is a measure called for by considerations of both justice and expediency, and calculated in its effects to promote the general interests of the company. No system for the re-establishment of the faith and credit of the company can be perfect without a measure of this character, and we therefore carnestly commend it likewise to the favorable consideration of the General Assembly.
