

Your Committee further report, that they have examined also the proceedings and documents of the said Treasurer, in reference to the several funds confided to his care, and find from an account settled 1st December 1850, by the Committee of Claims of the present General Assembly, there then remained in the Treasury, to the credit of the Free Schools Fund and the Sinking Fund, twenty thousand fifty-eight dollars and sixteen cents, (\$20,058.16.)

That it appears to your Committee, by the accounts of said Treasurer, he has received, from 1st December 1850, to 1st December 1851, viz:

That it appears to your Committee, the said Treasurer has disbursed, in the same time, the sum of two hundred and sixty-seven thousand seventy-five dollars and seventeen cents, (\$267,075.17,) viz:

For all of which payments he has presented to your Committee satisfactory vouchers.

That it appears to your Committee there remained in the Treasury, as of 1st December 1851, to the credit of the Free Schools Fund and Sinking Fund, a balance in cash of forty-two thousand nine hundred and forty-seven dollars and ninety-five cents, (\$42,947.95,) and this sum too, they find stands to his credit, as Treasurer, in the Farmers Bank of Maryland.
