The gross receipts from the items of revenue given in the above table were, in 1846, \$76,004.79; in 1847, \$91,860.40; in 1848, \$88,873.62; in 1849, \$101,299.03; in 1850, \$98,661.63; in 1851, \$114,639.03; in 1852, \$101,277.19; and the increase of the last over the first year named, comprising a period of seven years, was only \$25,272.40; whilst, the decrease of the last year, upon the returns for the year 1851, has been shown to be \$13,-361.84. It will also be perceived that there is a falling off, as compared with the receipts for 1849; and, but a small increase over those of 1850.

In the fifteenth section of Article IV, the Constitution imposes upon the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas of Baltimore City, the duty of issuing all marriage and other licenses required by law; which he accordingly does. The Clerk of the Superior Court, therefore, accounts to the Treasury upon the last four items specified in the above table; and, only in part, for the aggregate item given under the head of "Tax on Plaintiffs." He returned, during the past year, a gross amount of \$7,859.40; to which must be added, for the purpose of comparison, the returns of the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Baltimore County, upon the last five items, amounting to \$899.82; showing an aggregate of \$8,759.22. The Clerk of the former Baltimore County Court, (whose account embraced both returns) paid into
