And in regard to the deed from Deter Barger, the committee report that the Lots embraced in said deed were sold, as the property of owners unknown, for the opening of Division street, and produced as follows:

Which sum was handed over to N. Hickman, Agent for the Trustees of the Alms' House, 28th December, 1848, by City Register.

In regard to the discrepency between the Nos. 97, 98 and 99, which appears in the deed, and those by which the sale was effected in Nos. 24, 25 and 26, it is only necessary to remark, that the first refers to the number on S. Ettings' Plat, and the latter refers to the Commissioners' Plat for opening Division street, under which the sale was made.

The committee were continued.

STATEMENT

Of the Property owned jointly by the City and County of Baltimore, showing the manner in which the Title thereto was derived, as far as can be ascertained from the Records.

First. The Lot on which the Court House and Record Office stand. The title to this property, in the first instance, appears to have been derived exclusively under an inquisition and condemnation held in pursuance of an Act of Assembly of the Province of Maryland, passed in the year 1768, chapter 14, "for removing the seat of Justice from the town of Joppa, in Baltimore county, to Baltimore town, in said county, and for surveying and laying out a parcel of land in said town of Baltimore, for the use of the Public Court House and Prison in said town."

The inquisition held under this Act, bears date the tenth day of February, 1769, and was duly recorded the second day of March, 1796, in Liber W. G., No. U. U., folio 477, one of the land records of Baltimore county.

By the Act of 1797, chapter 73, entitled an Act for building a new Jail, in Baltimore county, and by the Supplement thereto, of
