To the Commissioners for dividing the joint property of the

County and City of Baltimore:

Gentlemen,—Conformably to the instructions of your committee Messrs. Bernard and Dushane, we have carefully surveyed and measured the various buildings at the City and County Alms House, (exclusive of the new fever Hospital,) and we have made estimates and calculations of the cost of erecting such buildings at the present time, the results of which we now respectfully submit.

The several stone, brick and framed buildings within the enclosure wall, the farmers house, stone barns, mill, the framed cribs, corn house, hay barracks, straw sheds, &c. &c., without, and the respective enclosing and retaining walls about or connected with the institution, in our opinion could be built for

(\$61,000,) sixty-one thousand dollars.
