the Chesapeake Bay.

304. An act to incorporate a Company to build a Turnpike Road from Woodsboro' to Monocacy Bridge, on the road leading to Frederick city.

305. An act providing for equal distribution among the dispensaries of the city of Baltimore, of the fines imposed in said city

for keeping houses of ill-fame.

306. An act to confirm the acts of Thomas C. Stump, of Har-

ford county, as a Justice of the Peace.

307. An act to authorise the County Commissioners of Frederick county in their discretion to levy a sum of money to build a Bridge over Catoctin Creek, on the public road leading from Myersville to Smithsburg.
