The Judge of the Criminal Court of Baltimore fixes the rates of charges of Inn Keepers, and others, who furnish meals and *refreshments* to Juries and Bailiffs, as follows:

For a meal and *refreshments* furnished, one dollar for each juror, and the same for the bailiff having them in charge. For lodgings furnished, fifty cents for each juror per night, and the same for each bailiff, in charge in cases where no meals and *refreshments* are furnished.

In cases where a meal or *refreshments* are furnished only, twenty
