

18th.

No Senator shall absent himself from the seat of Government without leave of the Senate.

19th.

No rule shall be dispensed with, without the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

20th.

When a question is under debate, no motion shall be received unless to adjourn, to lay on the table, to commit, to re-commit, to amend or to postpone the question to a day certain; which several motions shall have precedence in the order in which they are here stated.

21st.

A motion to adjourn shall always be in order, and shall be decided without debate.

22nd.

Any Senator may call for a division of a question when the sense will admit it.

23rd.

When a question has once been made and carried in the affirmative or negative, it shall be in order for any member of the majority to move for the re-consideration thereof; but no motion for the re-consideration of any vote shall be in order after a bill, resolution, message, report, amendment or motion, upon which the vote was taken, shall have gone out of the possession of the Senate, announcing their decision, nor shall any motion for re-consideration be in order, unless made on the same day on which the vote was taken, or within the two next days of actual session of the Senate thereafter.

24th.

The reading clerk of the Senate shall lay upon the desk of the President, every morning, all bills, resolutions and motions, depending before the Senate, in the order of time in which they were reported or presented for consideration; and, at all times while the Senate is sitting, when no motion is under consideration, the President shall, without any motion, take up said bills, resolutions and motions, in the above order, and propose them for the consideration of the Senate; and they shall then be considered and acted upon, unless postponed by the order of the Senate.

25th.

Whenever any bill, resolution, report or other proposition, shall have been read through a second time, with or without amend-
