

Rhode Island Legislative Resolves, Relative to Cheap Postage.
 STATE OF RHODE ISLAND AND PROVIDENCE PLANTATIONS.

IN GENERAL ASSEMBLY OCTOBER SESSION, A. D. 1854.—
 RESOLUTIONS IN RELATION TO CHEAP POSTAGES.

Resolved, That it is the true policy of every National Government to procure for its citizens the advantage of a regular and cheap correspondence with foreign Countries; and that the establishment by all maritime nations, of a uniform rate of Ocean Postage reduced to the lowest sum practicable, would tend to promote and extend the blessings of Commerce and Civilization and secure the peace of the world.

Resolved, That his Excellency the Governor, be requested to transmit to the Governors of the several States, and to our Senators and Representatives in Congress, copies of these Resolutions, to the end that the Government of the United States may be induced to co-operate in this important movement.
