the amount received during the fiscal year, ended 30th September 1854. This result was anticipated by the Comptroller and so stated in his last annual report to the Governor.

SUSQUEHANNA AND TIDE-WATER CANAL COM-PANIES.

Statement No. 10 shows, that these Companies paid, during the year; the sum of \$67,100 on account of current interest, and \$3,712.20 on account of interest on the unfunded debt of said Companies. The attention of the Legislature is due to the condition of accounts between the State and these Companies, that some specific arrangement may be made to fund the arrearages of interest due by them.

NORTHERN CENTRAL RAILWAY COMPANY.

Since the last annual Report of the Comptroller, the York and Maryland Line Rail Road Company and the Susquehanna Rail Road Company, in Pennsylvania, and the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company have been consolidated, and now constitute one Company under the name of the Northern Central

Railway Company.

In pursuance of the authority granted it by chapter 260 of 1854, that Company has mortgaged its entire Railway from Baltimore to Sunbury, with the tolls, &c., to the State of Maryland, to secure the annual payment of \$90,000, subject to extinguishment upon payment of the principal; and the Treasurer has assigned to it all the State's interest in the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company. The Northern Central Railway Company has paid punctually the quarterly installments assumed under the said Mortgage, and the State will, in all probability, now realise, as a certain source of income, the annual payment of \$90,000.

EMOLUMENTS OF CLERKS OF COURTS, &c.

It will be observed by an examination of Statement No. 7, that the sum of \$8,392.80 was received into the Treasury from Officers of the State, whose fees and emoluments exceeded the annual amount allowed by the Constitution and laws. Of this sum, the amount of \$2,500 was received from the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Frederick County for the years 1852, 1853 and 1854, leaving, as per his Report on file in this Office, a considerable sum, still uncollected, in the Sheriff's hands for the same years. The management of the Office of this Clerk is specially worthy of commendation. The Register of Wills of the same County has paid into the Treasury, on the same account, the sum of \$309.46. The State's Attorney for Baltimore City paid, on this account, \$2,396.48; the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas paid \$1,626.93; the Clerk of the Criminal Court of Baltimore paid \$1,344.20, and the Register of Wills for Baltimore City paid \$215.73. To all of these
