17th. Interrogatory answers and says: The following gentlemen who compose the present board of directors of said bank are bona-fide residents of the State of Maryland to wit: Dr. G. W. Goldsborough, Wm. Loockerman, Tilghman Nuttle, J. H. Bradley, P. D. Burgher, Chas. D. Gage, Samuel Waggoner non-resident, C. Bretz non resident.
