- 193. An act relating to fines, forfeitures and penalties.
- 194. An act to change the name of a certain village in Caroline county, known by the name of Snow Hill, to the name of Preston.
 - 195. An act more effectually to prevent gambling.
- 196. An act to repeal an act passed at January session, 1854, chapter 262, entitled, an act imposing a tax on dogs to protect the raising of sheep in Kent county.
- 197. An act to authorise the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Howard county, to have one of the index books in his office rebound.
- 198. An act relating to masters of vessels, sailors, and apprentices.
- 199. An act to authorise the county commissioners of Charles county to sell and dispose of certain warehouse property in said county.
- 200. An act to authorise the county commissioners of Worcester county, to sell a portion of the alms house property in said county.
- 201. An act to provide for the transcribing of certain records in the register's office of Worcester county.
- 202. An act appropriating a sum of money to pay William A. Speccer, Clerk of the Court of Appeals of Maryland, for fees due him.
- 203. An act for the relief of the president and trustees of Charlotte Hall School.
- 204. An act to authorise the commissioners of Anne Arundel and Prince George's counties, to levy a sum of money, to repair or rebuild a bridge, known as Priest's Bridge, over the Patuxent river.
- 205. An act to appoint an additional magistrate in Jackson district, Frederick county
- 206. An act to authorise the county commissioners of Baltimore county, to levy the sum of money therein named.
- 207. An act relating to the establishment of a light house on Drum Point, at the mouth of the Patuxent river in Calvert county and to cede to the United States the jurisdiction of the State of Maryland in, to and over a site for the same.
- 208. An act to authorise the county commissioners of Frederick county, at their discretion, to levy a sum of money to construct a bridge across Tom's Creek in Frederick county.
- 209. An act amendatory of the act to incorporate the Bank of Commerce, passed January session, 1854, chapter 235, and to increase the capital stock of said bank to one million of dollars.
