TOBACCO INSPECTIONS.

Table No. 6, of the Appendix, exhibits the receipts and disbursements on account of State Tobacco Inspections in Baltimore for the year 1860. The gross receipts, it will be perceived, were \$86,606.38; and the disbursements in the same period were \$81,510.08; leaving the sum of \$5,096.30 applicable to paying for building Warehouses, paying Interest, &c. The receipts are less than those of the preceding year by the sum of \$5,827.87; and the disbursements are less than those of the preceding year by the sum of \$12,744.43.

MISCELLANEOUS.

The Inspectors of Grain in the City of Baltimore returned to this Department, in the fiscal year, the sum of \$7,274.47; of which amount \$5,346.21 were disbursed for salaries and expenses; leaving the sum of \$1,928.26 in the Treasury to the credit of the Grain Fund, It appears by the monthly reports of the Inspector General, that 477,680 bushels of Wheat, and 585,656 bushels of Corn and other Grain were inspected during the year.

The late contractor for the Maryland Consolidated Lotteries has confessed judgment, with stay of execution for twelve months, for \$12,500; being the balance of his indebtedness on account of his contract. The Comptroller was induced to instruct the State's Attorney to accept the judgment with such stay of execution, on account of the existence of difficulties in making out the State's case.

The Agents of Foreign Insurance Companies paid into the Treasury, for Licenses, during the fiscal year, the sum of \$8,600; being a decrease of \$6,200, compared with the receipts of the preceding year from the same source. Table No. 10, contains the names of the Agents, and the several sums paid by each on that account.

The Weighmaster of Live Stock paid into the Treasury, during the fiscal year, \$10,053.89, which shows an increase of \$1,516.87 when compared with his returns of the preced-
