 the life time of their Testator that he their Testator
 ever used the least persuasions or any other means to
 induce her to make over any Interest she might then
 had in Scotland to his Brother nor do these Respon-
 dents know nor have they ever heard that the said
 Brother ever received any thing in view of any
 Assignment made by the Sibellans and these
 Respondents further say that they have been
 near Neighbours to their said Testator for
 Eighteen years last Past and does give an
