

The said John Gibbs several years before his
 Death shewed signs of frantick Madness or of
 Deep Melancholy. but on the contrary he always
 appears to be as much in his senses as he formerly
 had been and these Respondents admit it to be true
 that the Testator has made five or six different Wills
 but it is so far from being true that they were made
 whilst he was under a great Discomposure and
 Distraction of mind that he was incapable of
 Deliberation and Reflection that they believe they
 were made in his coolest hours and with great
 Deliberation and Reflection, and these Respondents
 say that they do not believe it to be true that the
 said Wills were destroyed by their Testator in favour
 of the Libellant but from some other motives, these
 Respondents believe it to be true that the said
 John Gibbs soon after the death of his Wife and
 upwards of Twelve years ago did make a Will
 thereby leave the greatest Part of his Estate to the
 Libellant but they believe that the un dutiful and
 headless Carriage of the Libellant induced him to
 destroy it they likewise believe that their Testator
 about a Year before his Death made another Will
 and thereby left the Libellant the Sum of One hundred
 Fifty Fifty Pounds but the Libellant shewing great
 unreasonings that she had not more left to her and
 behaving very un dutiful to the said John Gibbs
 he destroyed that Will likewise these Respondents
