As to the fifth Interrogatory saith that he does not think that John Gibb deceased was in his senses a little before his death and at least about ten days having conversed with him for sometime

As to the seventh & eight Interrogatories saith that he has heard John Gibb deceased in his life Time say that Janet Cleland was his sisters daughter & that she had been about sixteen years in Maryland.

As to the ninth Interrogatory he saith that upon the day the said John Gibb was buried he heard Janet Cleland ask James Mafsey a^f when he intended to go before the Commisary to prove John Gibbs Will that he gave her no Positive Answer only told her tomorrow or next day
