

To the third Interrogatory fourth and fifth saith that

 was obliged to leave him without concluding the Will

 that he has heard John Gibb say he brought her the
 Libellant his Niece from her own Country and made her
 dispose of her own Effects there in purpose to make her
 his heir in this Country & says he knows nothing more
 of the Matter
