he knew himself and also knew John Gibb as long  
and further saith that near the latter end of August  
in the Year of our Lord Seventeen hundred & forty seven  
he was sent for by John Gibb deceased to make his last  
Will and accordingly he went to him when John Gibb  
remained for a few Minutes, pretty sensible & told the  
Deponent to make his Will and to leave six Negroes  
to his Niece Janet Cleland some few Legacies besides &  
all the Rest of his Fortune to his Brother and other Relations  
in Scotland but in making the Will having occasion to  
ask him some Questions he seemed quite out of  
his senses and not capable of making a Will for after the  
Deponent read the copy of the Will he seemed quite insensible  
of what he read to him whereupon he read it a second time  
to him when the Deponent had papered over a good Deal  
of the Will in order to try John Gibb further he then told him  
he was very Right from which the Deponent further  
concludes him not in his senses but that he did not  
seem to sign seal or deliver it. J. Falconer
