To the Ninth Interrogatory this deponent saith that he has often heard the said John Gibb boast of his Bodily strength and the beauty of his person and that Women frequently fell in love with him since the death of his wife but how long since or before his own death does not remember, that the said John Gibb at the time of such Boasting to the best of this deponents Judgment was in his senses & capable of making a Will or of buying what he wanted or selling what he had to spare without being cheated or imposed upon.

To the Tenth Interrogatory this deponent saith that he has often seen the said John Gibb mad upon but never more violent than common in other People.

To the Eleventh Interrogatory this deponent saith that he knows nothing more than what he has before declared, saving that he often times went to see the said John Gibb in his last sickness and that he never found him at any of the said times anyway disordered in his senses.
