

The Depositions of Matthew Tilghman of Talbot County Gentleman Aged thirty Years who being duly & solemnly sworn on the holy Evangelists of Almighty God To the first Interrogatory Do saith and saith he knows James Hapsey Sen. one of the Respondents and has known him about Ten Years but does not know John Hadley Sen. the other Respondent or the Libellant

To the Second Interrogatory this Deponent saith that he knew John Gibb the Respondent Testator and had known him about eight years before his death and that he believes the said John Gibb died sometime in the year 1747

To the third Interrogatory this Deponent saith no. To the fourth Interrogatory this Deponent saith he knows not.
