To the tenth Interrogatory this Deponent saith that he never saw the said John Gibb fall into any violent fits of cursing damning & swearing Lastly this Deponent saith that the said John Gibb ~~appears~~ appears to him to have a tender regard for his Negroes and particularly for the little children of whom he was extremely fond and further saith not.
