To the Sixth Interrogatory this Deponent saith that he at the Request of the Libellant Janet Leland used many Arguments and persuasions with the said John Gibb to induce him to give the said Janet Leland some part of his Estate to which the said John Gibb gave for answer that the said Janet Leland had lived with him but that she went from him several times when he had the greatest Occasion for her and had behaved so ill that he was determined not to give her any thing this Deponent further saith that whether the Libellant was servicable or offensive to the said John Gibb he knows not nor does he know the Cause of her leaving him

To the Seventh Interrogatory this Deponent saith that he at the Request and by the Direction of the said John Gibb wrote a Will for him whereby he left all his Negroes free and devised his Lands to them and that the Will now Produced to this Deponent he believes to be a true Transcript of the Will by him wrote so far as relates to the said John Gibb setting his Negroes free and devising his Lands to them and that he knows nothing more in Relation to the said Seventh Interrogatory
