 gave them his estate both Real and Personal except
 a legacy to the son of Dowdall Thompson and a
 legacy to the Libellant of a yearly sum of Tobacco
 to be paid her by the Negroes but what sum does
 not remember, by the fifth Will the said John Gibb
 set all his Negroes free and gave them all his
 estate except a legacy to the said Dowdall Thompsons
 son of his Riding horse Bridle and saddle Gun &
 Plate and that the said John Gibb told this deponent
 his Reason for altering his Will was that his Negroes
 had never been under Subjection to any Person
 but himself that they were all of his own Passing
 and that they should not come under Subjection to
 anyone after his decease

 with the said John Gibb till his last sickness he
 has often heard the said John Gibb boast of his
 Great Learning Bodily Strength and the beauty
