To the ninth Interrogatory saith that he has often heard the said John Gibb boast of his great learning bodily strength and the Beauty of his Person and that Women frequently fell in love with him and at the time of such boasting the said John Gibb in the deponents Judgment was capable of making a Will or of buying what he wanted or selling what he had to spare.

To the tenth Interrogatory saith that he has often seen the said John Gibb in violent fits of cursing & swearing which in the deponents Opinion proceeded from heat of Passion and that after the said fits were over the said John Gibb at sometimes appeared to be sufficiently in his senses to make a Will or manage Common Affairs and at other times not.

To the eleventh Interrogatory saith he knows
