in his senses when he did so sign Publish the said
Will that the said Willis of the hand writing of
John Morris whom he saw write the latter part of it

To the fifth Interrogatory saith that he has
several times saw and conversed with the said
John Gibb and in particular on a Sunday about
six years before the said John Gibbs death as
this deponent and the said John Gibb was riding
to church the said John Gibb said that if he did not
alter his condition but lived single in the state
he then was he would at his death set all his
Negroes free and give them his estate and if they
had not sense enough to keep it they must suffer

To the sixth Interrogatory saith that the
Libellant did live in the house and family of the
said John Gibb that she left his family a great
many years before his death but upon what occasion
does not know that she returned to the said John
Gibbs house sometime in the Summer the said
John Gibb died, that he has heard the said John
Gibb say to the Libellant when she offered to
assist him in his sickness that she should not
touch him and that he did not want her to do any
thing for him, that at the first time of her living
with the said John Gibb he has seen her knitting
but does not know whether she contributed to
the increase of his estate or was an expence to him
