To the Ninth Interrogatory this Deponent saith that when he first saw the said Janet Cleland at the said John Gibbs the house and family were Cleaner and the Family Affairs in General seemed to be in better Order than usual and this Deponent further saith that the said John Gibb a few years before his death shewed him an executed Will by which he had given to the said Janet Cleland a yearly sum of Tobacco or Money and further saith not
